ECHO COST EFFECTIVE

ECHO is extremely cost effective at providing solutions to feed the hungry in the world. For approximately \$1/person/year, ECHO provides the knowledge, tools, and seeds for poor subsistence farmers to feed their families. They are able to provide those solutions at very low cost by having a substantial portion of their workforce being volunteers. ECHO is headquartered in their Global Farm in North Fort Myers and gives regular tours showing the plants and techniques they use to solve world hunger.
