- Restrooms will be open however, please limit to 2 people at a time and keep the main doors propped open.



After graduating from the University of Miami, Fleisher joined the Naples Philharmonic and the Miami City Ballet orchestra. He is the son of pianist Leon Fleisher and nephew of Edward Druzinsky, former principal harpist with The Chicago Symphony. Fleisher's two sisters are harpists in Miami and Washington.

Ms. Ishimaru has written extensive duo harp arrangements with her husband Dickie Fleisher, and together they gave recitals in US, Europe and Japan. They also enjoy collecting harps, one of which is a prized harp that belonged to Harpo Marx and was featured in his movies.
