#### Dexter Kennedy, Organ


2022 marks the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Belgian-French composer César Franck, whose organ works

arguably represent the most important contribution to the organ repertoire other than J.S. Bach, and charted the course for the entire French Romantic organ school. In commemoration of this anniversary, Dexter Kennedy is presenting Franck's complete organ works throughout the United States during this anniversary year, including the complete works performed in Naples. (Part I takes place February 13th at 4:00 at Trinity-by-the-Cove) As the winner of the 24th Grand Prix d'intérpretation at the 2014 Chartres International Organ Competition, he has been hailed "one of the greatest organists of our times" by *The Iceland Monitor*.
