

From our Pastor—The Rev. Robert J. Marrow

Dear Friends in Christ,

Perhaps you have heard me say that for our ministry to grow, we need to bless what exists and add what is needed. That continues to be an apt saying for the past few years as we discover new ways to be the church following the impacts that Covid had on our ministry.

The leadership of Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church worked diligently to overcome the obstacles placed upon us. Worship attendance has been drastically reduced when compared to pre-Covid rates. For example, our 2022 in-person average worship attendance was approximately 55% of what it was pre-Covid in 2019 (220 vs. 410).

The good news is that participation rates in worship and other ministries are on the rise! Over the past year, virtual worship, virtual meetings, and outdoor activities gave way to face-to-face gatherings. Yes, some people grew more comfortable with being in group settings. We also know that not all of our church family held that same level of comfort. In May of 2022, VPC gained the ability to Livestream our worship and other events from our sanctuary! Those participating via virtual worship, which was minimal in 2019, grew to a weekly average of 220 views last year. It is interesting to note that this number was closer to 300 weekly views during the month of December. We are blessing what exists while adding what is needed.

There were also several staff transitions during 2022. Parish Associate, Rev. Dr. Louis Thompson and Parish Nurse, Joyce Geary retired from their positions. Kathryn Baron, our Children's Ministry Assistant, left to fill the position of full-time grandma. There were also staffing transitions in our Learning Center as well. While we are grateful for their wonderful presence in VPC's ministry over the years, it is appropriate that we also celebrate the next chapter of their lives with them! We also remember the impact that Hurricane Ian had on many of the residents of Southwest Florida. Vanderbilt responded by helping our neighbors in need. These items stand as evidence that change is in fact the only constant in life. In the face of such change, our task is to ensure that VPC's ministry continues to move forward.

In an effort to build a stronger sense of community and to increase involvement in our ministry, we added what we call "Adventures in Membership" (AIM) each month. We also added monthly "Vanderbilt Lunch Bunch" gatherings following worship. In an effort to increase awareness of our building and ministries, regularly scheduled facility tours are now offered. We also increased the number of "Moments for Mission" during worship in order to highlight opportunities for you to serve our community. We are constantly seeking new and exciting ways to increase our presence in the Naples community and your awareness of these opportunities. Your involvement in the ministry of VPC is vital if we are to succeed!

Serving as your pastor continues to be a delight. TOGETHER, we served God! The Session, Deacons, members, EVERYONE! I would like to provide a special word of appreciation for the commitment and dedication displayed by the staff of VPC. Each member of the staff gave their best efforts to ensure that the ministry of Vanderbilt was done exceedingly well! So, thank you staff members!

If we are to bless what exists and add what is needed, your involvement is crucial! My friends, God calls each of us to serve in ways that we are able. On that note, I look forward to serving Christ with you in 2023! Pray for God's continued blessing on our ministry in the coming year. The goal of the music department at Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church is to glorify God through carefully prepared musical presentations both within the services of worship and in our concert series.

2022 returned to a somewhat normal schedule after the enormous challenges of the Covid period. I am eternally grateful to the Chancel Choir for coming back in full force in the Fall, preparing and presenting meaningful weekly anthems for church services, and preparing an amazing and uplifting Christmas season for all of us. A highlight was the Christmas Concert, featuring Mary McDonald's Festival of Christmas for choir, VandeReaders, soprano soloist Michele Byrd, organ, trumpet, and timpani. In the Spring, the Chancel Choir presented a concert of music by British composer John Rutter, including parts of his Mass of the Children.

They rehearse each Monday through Thursday in Cochran Hall, learning songs and playing bells, boom whackers, and drums! Special thanks to all of the Learning Center teachers and Directors for helping with daily rehearsals and concert preparations.

Having Julie Carver back on the music department staff has been a GODSEND! The choir responds so much better to a conductor who can use both hands to conduct, instead of one (me) who is playing with two feet and one hand and waving the other hand and bobbing his head at them!! Julie is the



A great big THANK YOU to Stan. We will miss your leadership in the bell department, but cannot wait to hear the drums again soon!


From our Director of Christian Education —Heather Mikes

Each week in the Vanderbilt Learning Center, the students, staff and I end our time together at Chapel with our "campfire song," It's actually called "Pass It On." I am brave enough to say it's their favorite part. No matter how we begin, whether it's a Bible story or a Bible lesson contained in another story book we get to read together, we always end the same. We gather in a tightly-knit circle of strength and safety in a dimly lit room. There is a light at our center — the pretend campfire that glows so brightly, they can't help but want to reach out and touch it! What is it about the light that makes us want to run toward it and feel its warmth? We nestle in together and quiet our minds and focus our hearts on the message we are about to receive. When the song begins, I place a battery-operated tea light in the hands of an eager child and they hold it carefully in their palms. The light flickers. At first, we learned to just pass it gently. Over the course of the year, they have learned to pause and reflect on their own conversation with God in a moment of silence, just as we do together during Worship on Sunday. When they open their eyes, I am met with an expectant gaze, as if they have been filled with all kinds of love and goodness and are prepped and ready to leave our room to tackle something amazing. Small acts of love and kindness begin here. They spill out of our Student Center and into our school. They pour into our pews, roll out of our sanctuary and into the community. Then, these small acts become something much bigger than us, and they overflow into the world.

This activity is a visible demonstration of how we share God's love and light in the world. I want them, and you, to know that people see God's love and His light through you. What a gift! We have the opportunity each and every day, in every single moment, to be a model of Christian love. We can be the light that helps someone find their way out of the darkness.

Whether you are two or 12 or 20 or 42 or 92, the world can sometimes feel overwhelming. Sometimes we struggle. We trust God to help us do the next right thing. We pray with childlike faith and we ask God for the strength to live in a broken world, to hope for a brighter tomorrow, to love without bounds expecting nothing in return, to overflow with grace and peace. We adapt. We overcome. We grow and we bloom.

Christian Education comes in many forms with Christ at the center. Our faith journeys are all different.



Morning or night, on any day of the week, there are many ways to spend time in the Word that immerse you, inspire you and transform you. Our education team is here to support and encourage you, to provide tools and resources, to teach and equip you to teach others. So, go be great!

From the Clerk of Session-Richard A. Hilton

The year 2022 was marked by a return to some degree of normalcy. The vaccination percentages were high enough that we began to have hybrid meetings, in that we used both the Zoom format and some in-person meetings as well.

Now, as the year has ended we are increasing our in-person attendance for worship services and have even introduced an 8:30 service for the winter "season." We have introduced "live streaming" of our Sunday service and eliminated the need for a pre-recorded service.

During the year we held three new members classes and added 31 people to our church family. We re-introduced many activities that fell by the wayside during the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2022 we started up our concert series once again with outside guest musicians and are on our way to a good year.

In the process of doing the church's business your Session held 10 Stated meetings, 6 Called meetings, and 3 Congregational meetings during 2022.

Throughout the course of the year we increased our return to normalcy in both church attendance and church activities. But one area has lagged behind the rest, and that is our Stewardship. While other parts of our experience together were returning, our offerings to the church operation

Budget, Finance & Investment Oversight Team

Team's purpose:

2022 was another difficult year for the Church financially due to the uncertainty of Covid-19 and its impact on the membership. The Budget, Finance and Investment Oversight Committee was still able to carry out their purpose to ensure the "wise use of God's gifts." We were able to guide the Session and the Ministry Teams through the 2022 budget process, insure financial support for the church programs and projects while maintaining the financial integrity of all activities.

Description of Team's Work:

- Coordinate the 2022 annual budget process, working closely with the ministry teams and Session.
- Monitor VPC's financial operating performance vs. budget, reporting to Session monthly.
- Manage the disbursement of funds raised in the capital campaign "Splendid Giving," as well as capital reserve funds.
- Ensure the safety of the church's financial assets and adherence to accounting policies and procedures.
- Remain aware of and take advantage of opportunities for additional funding and recommend programs beneficial to VPC.
- Stay aware of and financially support the long range as well as short range VPC initiatives and goals.

2022 Accomplishments:

- Navigated the 2022 operating expenses, in order to stay within the available reduced revenue as a result of less membership and attendance.
- Recommended a 2023 Budget to Session that was a reduction from the Ministry Teams' requests but still maintained a balanced budget.
- Supported the Capital Campaign which enabled us to pay off the PILP mortgage.
- Converted our account system from the server-based ACS to the Cloud-based REALM system.
- Transferred the Endowment accounts from the Church to the Endowment Trust.
- Supported the work to increase membership.

Looking Forward:

- Develop recommendations to balance the Church's budget.
- Complete the 2020 audit.
- Explore option to increase revenue and reduce expenses.

Treasurer's Report-Max Gould, Treasurer

Highlights

Vanderbilt Church (VPC) and Learning Center (VLC) had mixed results financially in 2022. Combined Net was a small deficit of \$7K. The Learning Center had a Net surplus of \$74. However, the Church had an operating deficit of \$81K. Total income was \$1,737K, less than plan by \$61K and less than 2021 by \$81K. Combined expenses were \$1,745K, less than budget by \$38K but higher than 2021 by \$135K.

Church

VPC income for the year was \$1,207K, less than the budget by \$101K and less than 2021 by \$84K. Congregational gifts of \$1,138K were less than plan by \$36K but higher than 2021 by \$6K. Other income was \$37K, less than plan by \$62K and less \$92K less than 2021. The short fall from budget was because the Other Income budget called for using \$93K from our investments, but the Budget, Finance and Investment team decided it was better to use surplus operating cash. The 2021 difference was because we received a \$126K PPP grant. Program income was \$33K, less than budget by \$2.5K but higher than 2021 by \$2K. VPC full year expenses were \$1,288K, less than budget by \$20K. The major variances less than plan were Education (\$14K), Worship (\$7K) and Administration and Personnel both (\$7K) less. Building and Grounds was over budget by \$13K. VPC Net for the year was a deficit of \$81K.

Vanderbilt Learning Center

VLC full year income was \$530K, better than plan by \$39K and \$3K higher than 2021. VLC expenses for the year were \$456K, less than budget by \$18K but higher than 2021 expenses by \$28K. VLC had a surplus for the year of \$74K.

Directed Gifts

We received \$92.5K of directed gifts, higher than last year by \$20K. These funds which disbursed to other charities or missions during the year. The Directed Gifts included Hurricane IAN relief funds.

Mortgage

In April we paid off our mortgage using Capital Campaign funds, the remaining Deo Gloria reserve, part of the money invested in PILP and some from operating cash. We still have \$93,385 invested in PILP.


Audit

In order to properly reflect the status of the Endowment Trust as a separate corporation, the Auditors instructed to move the Endowment funds of \$700K from the Church assets to the Endowment Trust. The Auditors then focused on completing four years of Tax Returns for the Endowment Trust. These efforts delayed work on the Church Audit. We expect to complete the audit in the first half of 2023.

Balance Sheet


As of the end of 2022, the Church had total assets of \$10,523K. Of this, \$9,303K are in Fixed Assets (Buildings, Land, Furnishings). Of the remaining \$1,220K, \$92K is donor restricted.








Buildings & Grounds Team

The Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church Buildings and Grounds Team oversees the maintenance and care of the church facility, property, and furnishings. This includes the church campus grounds, parking lots, and the residential house (manse) located next door at 1301 Piper Blvd. The team is also involved with developing the annual operational budget, deciding capital replacement needs and recommending an annual capital budget allocation. As of the end of December 2022, Buildings and Grounds was operating over budget by (\$13,105).


Highlights of projects conducted in 2022:

- Updated the fire protection panel and added addressable duct smoke detectors for enhanced control and safety. Replaced older and incompatible duct fire detectors.
- Installed the now operational "live streaming" system, bringing worship services *live* into homes.
- Repaired eroded/unstable sidewalk (with guardrail) outside of the Student Center west entrance door.
- Replaced water fountains in west wing through donations to allow more sanitary bottle filling.
- Installed a half basketball court in the west parking lot for church youth and community use.
- Replaced sod in VLC playground
- Arranged and participated in Active Shooter Training with CC Sheriff's Office, reviewed safety plans.
- Replaced irrigation pump and updated irrigation system.
- Hurricane Ian; steeple was inspected in detail and found to have no structural damage. Backlot fence (700 feet) needs to be replaced.

Plans and considerations in 2023:

- Repair the AC condenser pan located over kitchen
- Replace the VLC door locks
- Repair chancel steps
- Replace backlot fencing
- Repair paver blocks in a limited area
- Replace ice maker in kitchen
- Further expand our digital footprint in the church and explore items such as:
 - \Rightarrow expand Wi-Fi nodes throughout
 - \Rightarrow convert to fiber optic cable for internet
 - \Rightarrow increase bandwidth for consistent internet speed
 - \Rightarrow replace telephone system with VOIP devices
 - \Rightarrow obtain a digital security system for the entire church campus
 - \Rightarrow update exterior storefront doors with new locking mechanisms
- Wish list items, needing funding:
 - \Rightarrow a security system with cameras campus wide
 - \Rightarrow security related attention to all storefront doors that often do not latch properly
 - ⇒ consider making some storefront doors egress only as there are simply too many access points in the church.
- Always present:
 - \Rightarrow building complete patching and caulking and repainting



Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church.



- Learned about the importance of our community connections with visits from CCSO, NNFD and Collier County Waste Management (Recycling) and others throughout the year.
- Joyfully participated in Wednesday Night Lights, Chalk the Lot, Trunk or Treat, the Unrehearsed Christmas Pageant and so many more exciting events in the life of Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church and Vanderbilt Learning Center!
- Led by example in charitable giving to missions of VPC including the Hurricane Ian Recovery Efforts, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Fund, Salvation Army and Mision Peniel Christmas Toy Drive, Collier Harvest and the Shelter for Abused Women and Children. VLC families collected supplies for Humane Society Naples following instructional visits to the school in January. Little by little, we are making a big difference and helping our students understand that small acts of kindness turn into something really big. We see God's light through them and encourage them to share it with others!





Membership & Involvement Team

As the year began our Team was still taking attendance by checking people's names off as they entered the church. We continued this procedure but moved inside the Narthex during the colder months. In-person church attendance definitely improved as the year began.

In March we resumed using the green attendance folders which were put back in the pews so the parishioners can mark their attendance. We added updated blue cards to be used by the first time and newer visitors. We continue to use the information we receive on the cards to contact people.

On February 27 we had a new member class where eight active members and three affiliate members joined our church.

During March and April, members of the team contacted all church members who had not been attending in-person church services. We found that most had been attending our virtual church services and were still not comfortable going out into crowded places. They really did enjoy the online connection and also our follow-up calls. This information was shared with the staff and appropriate committees.

In June we began working with Soukup Strategic Solutions, a marketing & sales promotion consultant the Session had engaged to help us seek new ways to encourage new membership. It was suggested that we expand upon some of the things we were already doing.

- Greeters would return to the Narthex at the end of the service to encourage folks into Fellowship Hall.
- Goodie bags were given out to visitors: Hershey bars wrapped in picture of the church plus a newly designed welcome flyer and crocheted prayer square.
- Soukup subsequently worked with Pastor Rob, Lisa Lloyd and staff encouraging more Facebook and video use. Rob's "Under the Spire" weekly video is a result of these suggestions. Also our weekly Constant Contact notices are all examples of the increased media coverage we have added

to VPC"s outreach program.

• Tours of the church were another suggestion which we instituted. We now conduct them monthly.

AIM (Adventures In Membership) is the new format which we introduced for the new members class. Instead of one or two large classes during the year, we



decided to try smaller, shortened monthly meetings right after church in the sanctuary. So far we have had two of these and they have been very well received.

On October 2, 14 new members joined as active members. At that time, we also introduced our Lunch Bunch where Rob invites the new members to join Beth & him for lunch. Session members host other groups at various restaurants near church. The response to these outings has been very positive.

M & I hosted a reception after the choir Christmas concert. It was a joyous occasion enjoyed by all.

We continue to sell our blue shirt and caps with the VPC logo.

We are encouraged as more people are returning to our services. We hope this will continue as we come back from the effects of Covid.

Café of Life is a mission located in Bonita Springs. We provide a hot meal, which we cook and serve, to between 100~120 people on the last Friday of the month. Habitat for Humanity of Collier County is part of a worldwide non -profit organization. We send workers to help build homes in Collier County each Wednesday morning from October-April. Helps Outreach has a collection box in the church office area and the food is delivered periodically to them. New Horizons is a faith based mission to help children and first generation Americans by providing tutoring and helping mentor them. Through the Peace **River Presbytery**, VPC participants help migrant workers in Immokalee by supporting them spiritually and with material care. We have congregants volunteer there at least 5 times a year. We work with the Salvation Army's summer camp by sponsoring children who can't afford to attend, and also the Toys for Tots program. Weekend **Power Packing** has volunteers who pack approximately 1400 bags of meals a year for 40 children who are either at the poverty level or below it who attend Sabal Palm Elementary in Collier County. We keep up with Grace Place through our members who are on the board and support their projects. It was great to welcome back the Heifer Fair this year. It was very successful, and it is well supported by our congregation. We have reconnected with our fellow church in Cuba and there will be a church led mission there in May.

Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry has a long and successful history

at VPC offering quality Christian care to our congregation. It began here in 1998 under the direction and active participation of *Rev. Dr. Thomas P. Harp* and two members of our congregation. Over the following years, an additional -----95 VPC members have been trained and commissioned to serve as Stephen

Ministers. Our stated Mission is: To offer confidential and distinctively Christian care by providing equipped lay ministers to those who are experiencing life changing circumstances.

Changes during 2022:

Stephen Leaders – Jon White retired after twentyfour years of service and Cherry Jacobus retired after nineteen years of service, both highly valued as Stephen Ministers and, subsequently, Stephen Leaders. Karen Chappler and Jody Nowry successfully completed Stephen Leader training in November and, as you read this, have been Commissioned as such in early January, 2023.

Stephen Ministers – *Finley and Jean Lee* died on February 13 and November 25, respectively. The following Stephen Ministers completed Stephen Minister Training in early 2022: *Dixie Bibb* (who subsequently moved away before her Commissioning), *Joan Butler, Barbara Green, Jody Nowry, and Lee Weeks.*

Our monthly Supervision/Continuing Education meetings usually took place on the first Thursday of the month and for part of the year were conducted by Zoom due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Since May of 2014, thanks to the efforts of Bob and



From the Board of Deacons—Janice Fern, Moderator

Deacons serve the church body and support the church staff in whatever ways they are called. Deacons are the "servants" or "caregivers" of the congregation.

The specific ministries are: Assisted Living Visitations, Bereavement Receptions, Blood Drives, Communion Preparation, Flower Delivery, Hospital Calls, and Sunday Letters of Joys and Concerns.



While in-person hospital visits continued to be suspended, members signed up to be Deacon of the Day and reached out by telephone and card ministries to those who were hospitalized. Each Sunday church members signed prepared letters that were sent to those on our prayer list. Monthly Communion continued using the packaged elements. Easter Lilies and Christmas Poinsettias were personally delivered to members. From our four Blood Drives, 82 pints

of blood were collected with the equivalent of saving approximately 216 lives. Three Bereavement Receptions were served following memorial services, and we sponsored four Fellowship Hours. The Deacons sponsored eight children to the Salvation Army's Camp Keystone. After Hurricane Ian members assisted Faith Presbyterian Church in Cape Coral by cleaning up the yard and then coming back on a Sunday to cook and serve dinner (see photo below).

From the Endowment Trust Board

Purpose. In 2015, the Endowment Trust concept was authorized by the Session and the Trust was incorporated in Florida. The current By Laws are designed to provide funds outside of the operating budget to further the ministry of Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church. Ordinarily, to conserve the purchasing power of the trust assets, annual distributions cannot exceed 5% of the total assets. Five of the six funds have donor guidelines about how the distributions can be utilized. Distribution requests are submitted to the Session and the Board for approval.

Portfolio Management. All six Endowment Funds are managed by the New Covenant Trust at the Presbyterian Foundation and are invested in mutual funds. The asset allocation is presently 65% equity and 35% fixed income. Financial markets had a very difficult 2022. The U.S. stock and bond indexes had negative total returns of 19% and 13%. The value of our Endowment Funds declined 15.8% after adjustments for distributions and inflows. New Covenant's benchmark return declined 16.2% and their performance was slightly positive when compared to the benchmark.

Distributions. During 2022, the Board approved and distributed the following amounts for ministry projects approved by Session: \$20,000 for Membership outreach assistance, \$4,200 to Habitat for Humanity, \$5,000 to inform Naples schools about our Youth Ministry, and \$5,000 to fund the Christmas Brass Concert. In addition, the Board expended \$6,000 to improve our Legacy Gift outreach.

Gifts to the Endowment Funds. The Endowment received over \$12,500 in Legacy Gifts from estate settlements in 2022.
