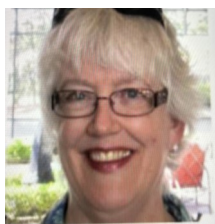
2023 ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Nominees for Elder – Class of 2026:



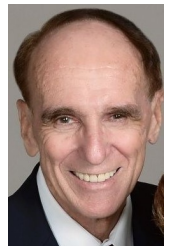

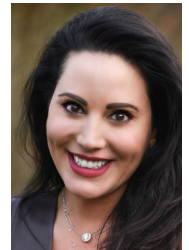
