

John Cummins, Organist



The opening concert this season will feature John Cummins, organist. Dr. Cummins is in his sixteenth year as Organist/Choirmaster at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Winston-Salem, North Carolina where he plays the historic E. M. Skinner organ Op. 712 from 1928, directs the St. Paul's Choir and the Friends of Music at St. Paul's concert series. He holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance from the Eastman School of Music in the studio of Professor David Craighead Vanderbilt's own Director of Music, Dr. James B. Cochran.

Through the Friends of Music at St. Paul's Concert Series, St. Paul's Church has become the Winston-Salem home of the North Carolina Baroque Orchestra and Chamber Players. This focus on Early Music in the concert series has filled a vital niche in the already rich musical life of the Winston-Salem community.

His program will feature works by Widor, Couperin, Bach, Locklair, Sandresky, and Vierne, including the thrilling *Carillon de Westminster*.


Duo Arpeggione Catherine Lan, Pianist

Frédéric Chopin, Gabriel Fauré, and Camille Saint-Saëns were all celebrated pianists, organists, and composers. Chopin in particular wrote almost exclusively for the piano. They each had a dear cellist friend for whom they dedicated beautiful duos as tokens of their friendship and mutual admiration. You will hear Chopin's and Saint-Saëns' gorgeous sonatas, as well as a lovely musical depiction of a butterfly, performed by cellist Claudio Jaffe and pianist Catherine Lan. Duo Arpeggione was formed in 2017 by Drs. Catherine Lan and Claudio Jaffe. Since then they have delighted audiences with their passion for music making and excellence in performance. Each recital includes insightful commentary on the composers and their work, enhancing the concert experience.

The 239 Collective is an Orlando-based jazz group led by drummer, Christian Snedeker and his partner, Orlando vocalist, Lexi DeLaRosa. The group features a mixed roster of musicians with a wide array of experiences and come together to play music of all styles, including swing, bop, Latin, and R&B. The 239 Collective's sound is new and exciting, yet you can hear the influences of the jazz greats in their approach and execution. The group's mission every live performance is to provide the audience with an escape from everyday life, and create a beautiful experience of music that showcases each performer's strengths. Highlights of the concert include: Afro Blue by Santamaria, Yes and No by Wayne Shorter, and Bolivia by Cedar Walton.

The Winner of the Dr. James B. Cochran Organ Prize: Augustine Sobeng

Augustine Sobeng is a native of Shama in the Western Region of Ghana. In 2019, he received admission under a VPA Fellowship award to study for his Masters in Organ Performance in the studio of Dr. Annie Laver.



He is currently pursuing his DMA in Organ Performance and Literature, in the studio of Nathan Laube, at the Eastman School of Music, Rochester. He is the organ scholar at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Rochester. Augustine was named to *The Diapason's* 2021 class of 20 under 30. In May 2021, he won first prize in the 'solo instrumental work' category for the Setnor Outstanding Artists' Competition at Syracuse University. In 2024 he was awarded the James B. Cochran Award for his outstanding DMA recital. Sobeng will play works by Buxtehude, Dupré, Sowerby, Widor and Franck.
